### From the desk of Rabbi Mann: Sukkot—A Microcosm of Judaism

The upcoming holiday is really a four-in-one Festival. Sukkot commemorates the Israelites' wandering in the desert after the Exodus from Egypt, under the protective Hand of G-d's providence.

On the sixth day of this holiday, a ceremony took place in the Temple in Jerusalem. While, for six days, the altar would be encircled by the people with their Four Species in hand (Lulavim, Etrogim, Hadassim and Aravot), on the sixth day an additional ceremony took place. The Aravot (willows) were taken separately and the people made a procession around the altar. This was called Simchat Beit Hasho'eva - a Celebration of Drawing Water. This tradition was expanded throughout the centuries, and involved saying prayers for rain and Hoshanot, prayers for deliverance and redemption. On the sixth day, Hoshannah Rabba, all the prayers were again recited in their entirety. It was also conceived as a belated Yom Kippur - a final opportunity for repentance - which would hopefully

result in G-d granting adequate rainfall for the upcoming season.

Shemini Atzeret, the Eighth Day of Convocation, is really a distinct holiday on its own. It occurs on the eighth day of the Festival of Tabernacles, but has its own name and identity. It symbolizes G-d's yearning to be with His people, like the song says, "Oh, won't you please, just stay a little bit longer".

Simchat Torah (a Rabbinic addition to the Biblical holidays) celebrates the annual completion of reading the Torah. In Israel it is celebrated on Shemini Atzeret, while in the Diaspora it is celebrated on the next day.

Taken together, these holidays focus on inculcating the ideals of remembering the past (and present) gratitude to G-d, prayerful dependence and confidence in G-d's saving grace, the centrality of the Torah in our lives and the importance of Community as part of being a Covenantal people.

## Temple B'nai Israel's Message from the President

Dear B'nai Israel Family,

When many adult Jews are asked what they associate most with the High Holidays—most will respond with “...friends, family, good food, no food (feasting and fasting), attending services and finding spirituality”. Most folks agree that it's about Tradition—L'dor V'dor—from one generation to another. If our parents didn't pass tradition on to us—how would we know anything? And if we don't pass tradition onto our children, how can we expect Judaism to flourish in future generations? That's what community is all about.

This year the High Holidays actually began with a wonderful dinner catered by the Sisterhood. Thank you to everyone who pitched in to shop, cook, and get that dinner served. And our traditional Yom Kippur Break the Fast was once again handled by Susan Leader with funding provided by many member families. Thank you!

For the second year, we had two services simultaneously—different, but with the same end result, a link to G-d. Thank you Rabbi Mann and Rabbi Graff for leading beautiful Traditional services and thank you to Karen Christenson, Bruce Goldsmith and Ron Ramer for creating and leading most inspiring Renewal services.

Our Board of Education, under the leadership of Paula Krapf, hired long-time member Barbara Sered Zabelin to direct our school and get it organized. We now have a full staff of teachers and many children attending classes from Preschool through Confirmation. (And yes, it is back to Confirmation).

# What's Happening in Religious School



Welcome back! We are so pleased to have such wonderful new and returning families with us this year.

We've taken the opportunity to implement some exciting changes to our school and curriculum. Below are a few highlights of the innovations:

- Our weekly Sunday School routine begins with a brief service/assembly, which includes announcements, student presentations and prayer. Parents are encouraged to attend. Students and parents report to the Sanctuary and sit with their classes. After the 15-20 minute session ends, teachers escort their students back to their classrooms.
- Parent communication is now enhanced, and all teachers are sending brief weekly emails summarizing lessons and including reminders about upcoming events. We are improving use of our website - adding news and updates, as well as downloadable materials and links to useful information online.
- Our Wednesday school program includes Hebrew, which will give our students more time learning this critical skill. Our goal is to ensure that all our students achieve a basic level of competency with the Hebrew prayer service by the time they reach B'nai Mitzvah. Of course, students who show aptitude and interest to achieve beyond this level will be motivated and encouraged to reach higher levels of scholarship.
- We've initiated a Parent-Teacher Club (PTC) to coordinate parent volunteerism and as a vehicle for parent-teacher interaction. The PTC will be hosting its first event, a Pasta Lunch and Family Bunco afternoon. Look for the flyer shortly.
- Families and staff are doing their part to help support our Temple by purchasing Scrip, also known as Mitzvah Money.

We are very fortunate to have such motivated, caring, and hard-working students, parents, Rabbi, teachers, aides, volunteers, Board members, and Temple leadership. Together we all can accomplish great things.

We want to extend a special thank you to Anna Kurtzman for her years of service on the TBI Board of Education. We appreciate Anna's years of service, and she will be missed on the Board.

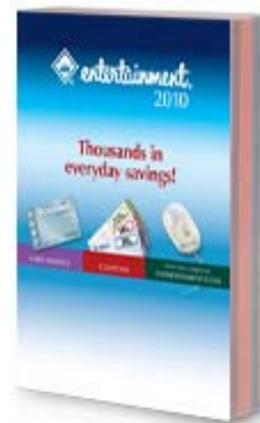

### 10 THINGS CONGREGANTS CAN DO TO PREVENT DOMESTIC ABUSE

*“In the Torah there can be no compromise on human dignity.”*

1. Recognize that domestic abuse is not only a woman’s issue, but a community issue.
2. Understand that abuse is not always physical: it can also be emotional, verbal, economic or sexual.
3. Don’t be a bystander or look the other way. You can hold perpetrators accountable and provide them with resources and encouragement to choose non-violence.
4. Lead by example. Teach your sons, grandsons and nephews how to be a man in ways that don’t involve degrading or abusing women.
5. Teach your daughters, granddaughters, and nieces to respect themselves and to know that abuse is never acceptable or justified under any circumstances.
6. Encourage your synagogue, schools, office to provide adult education about respect, anger and abuse and youth education about healthy relationships.
7. Boycott magazines, videos or music that promotes violence against women and girls.
8. Understand your own attitudes and actions toward women; have the courage to look inward.
9. Collaborate and support SHALVA by being a fundraiser, joining the SHALVA board, volunteering your services and expertise.
10. Reach out to someone you are concerned about and refer them to SHALVA; all services are free and confidential.
